Here a miaow, there a miaow,

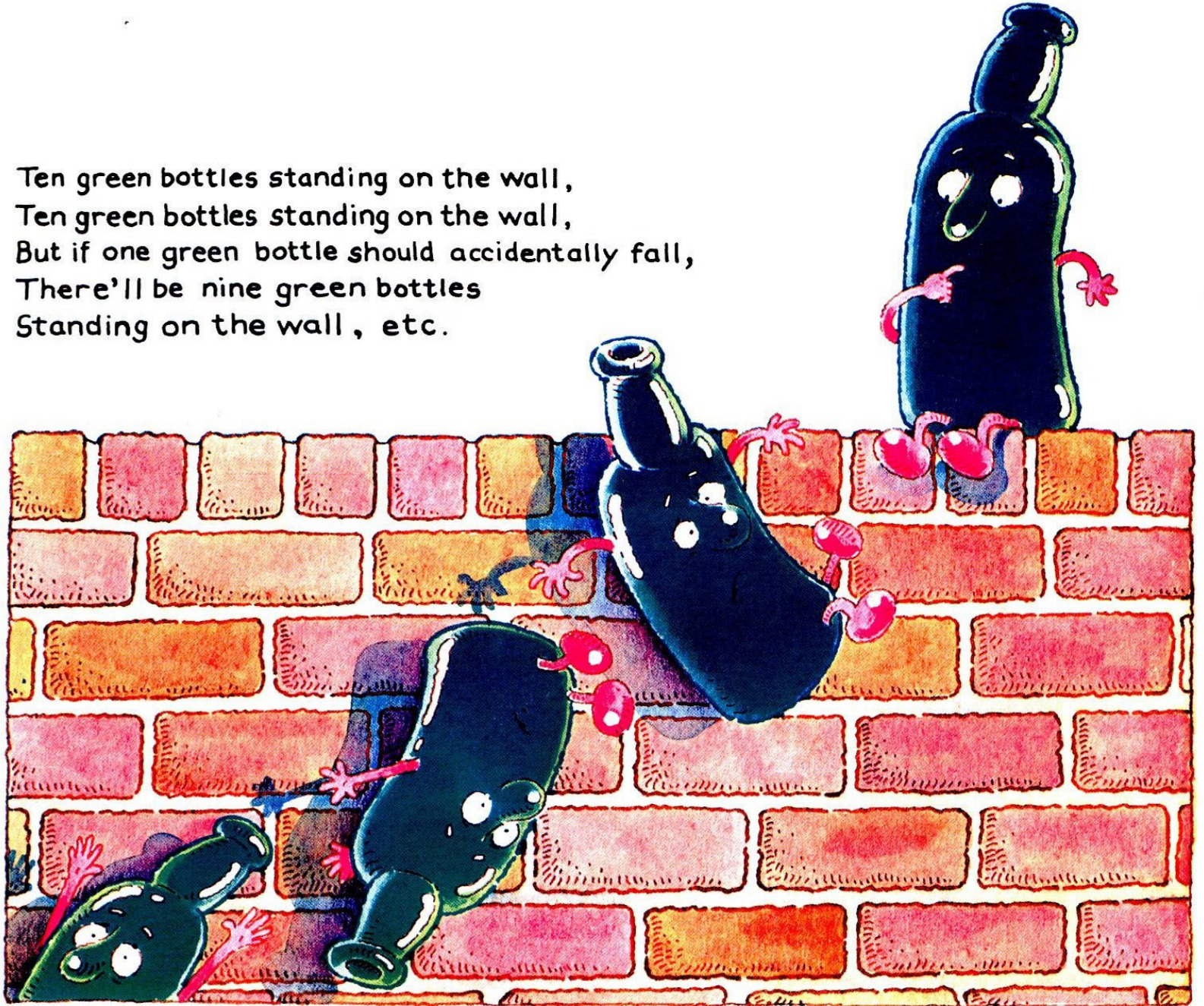
Everywhere a miaow-miaow.

Pour on water, pour on water.

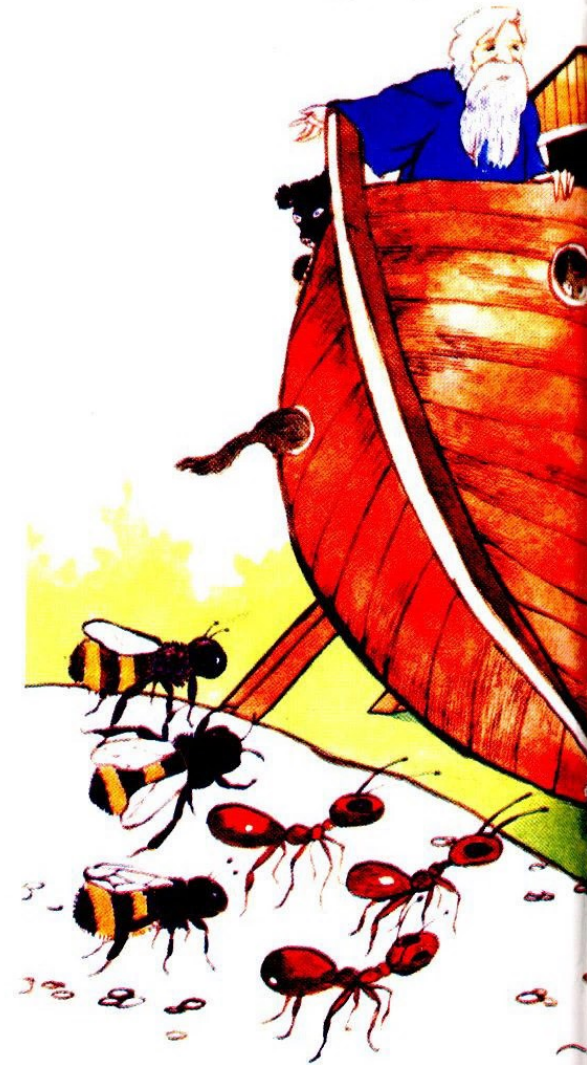

Just you and me.

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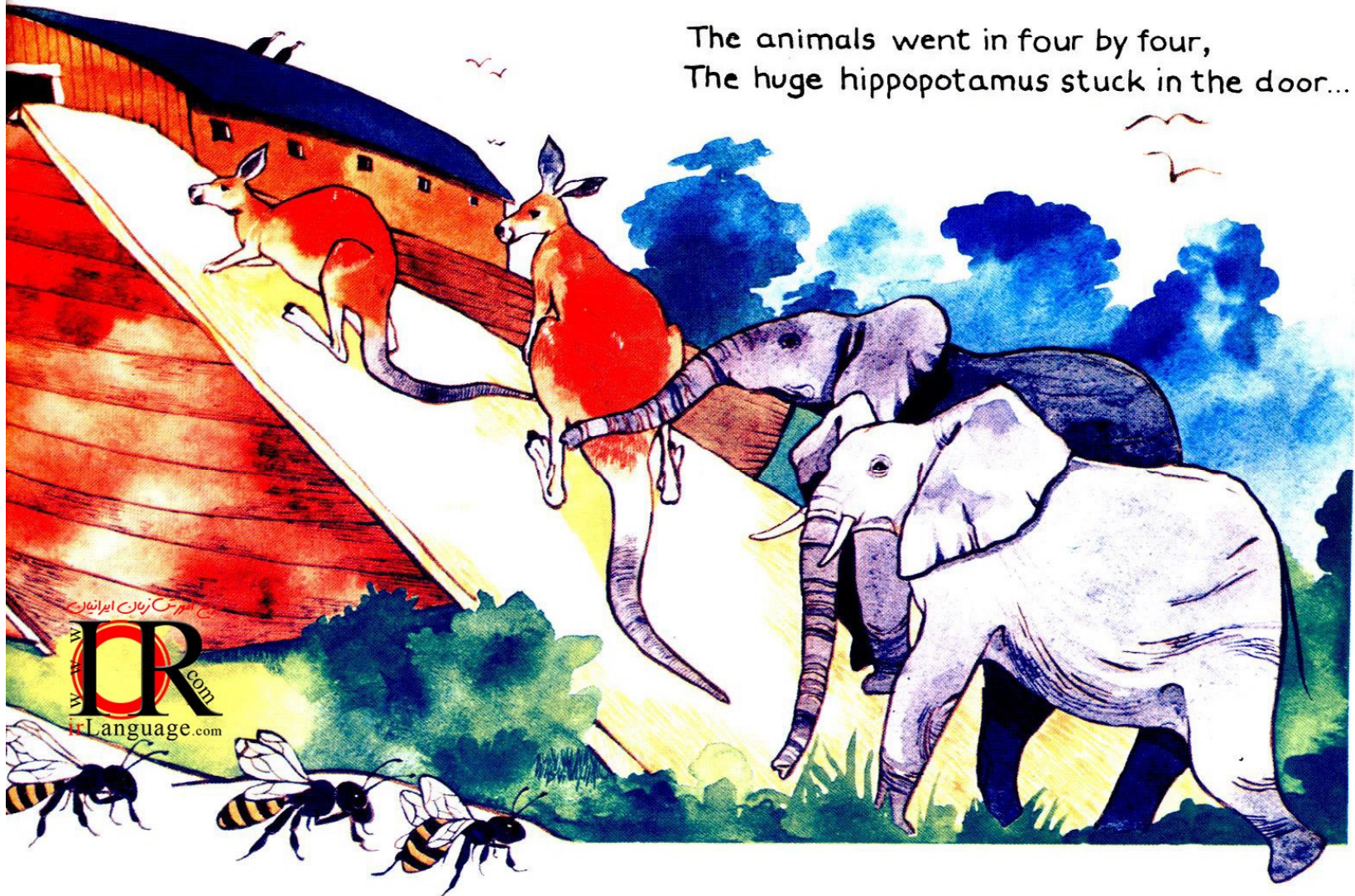
THE ANIMALS WENT IN TWO BY TWO

And I'll take fourpence home to my wife.

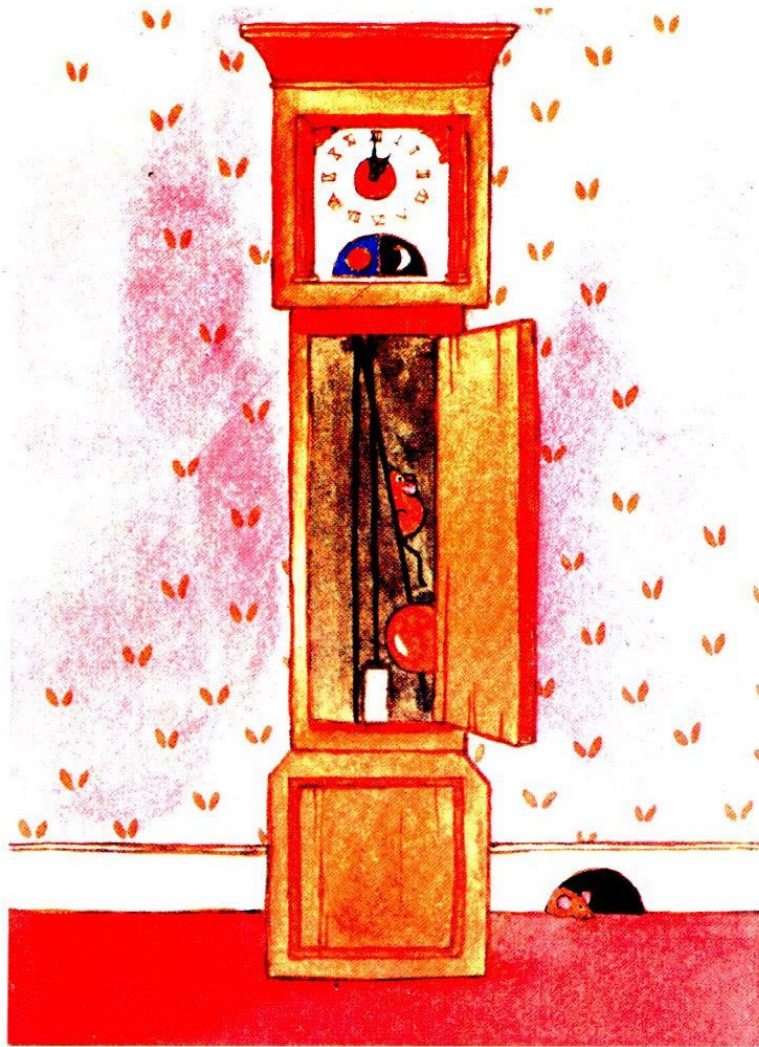

Hickory, dickory, dock.

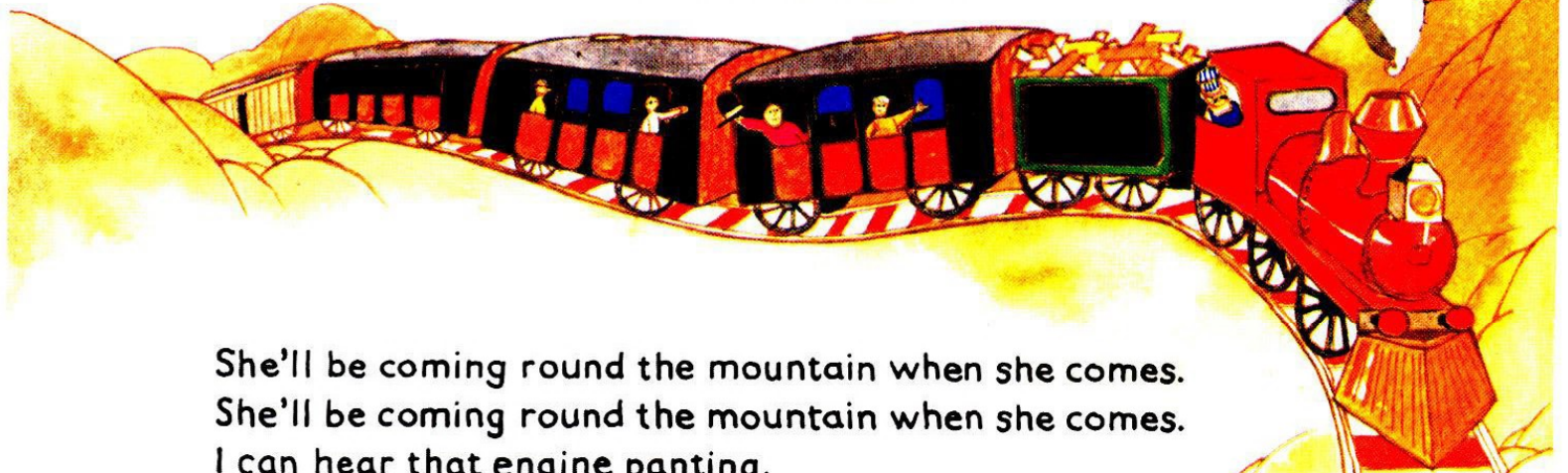
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POP GOES THE WEASEL

Pop goes the weasel!

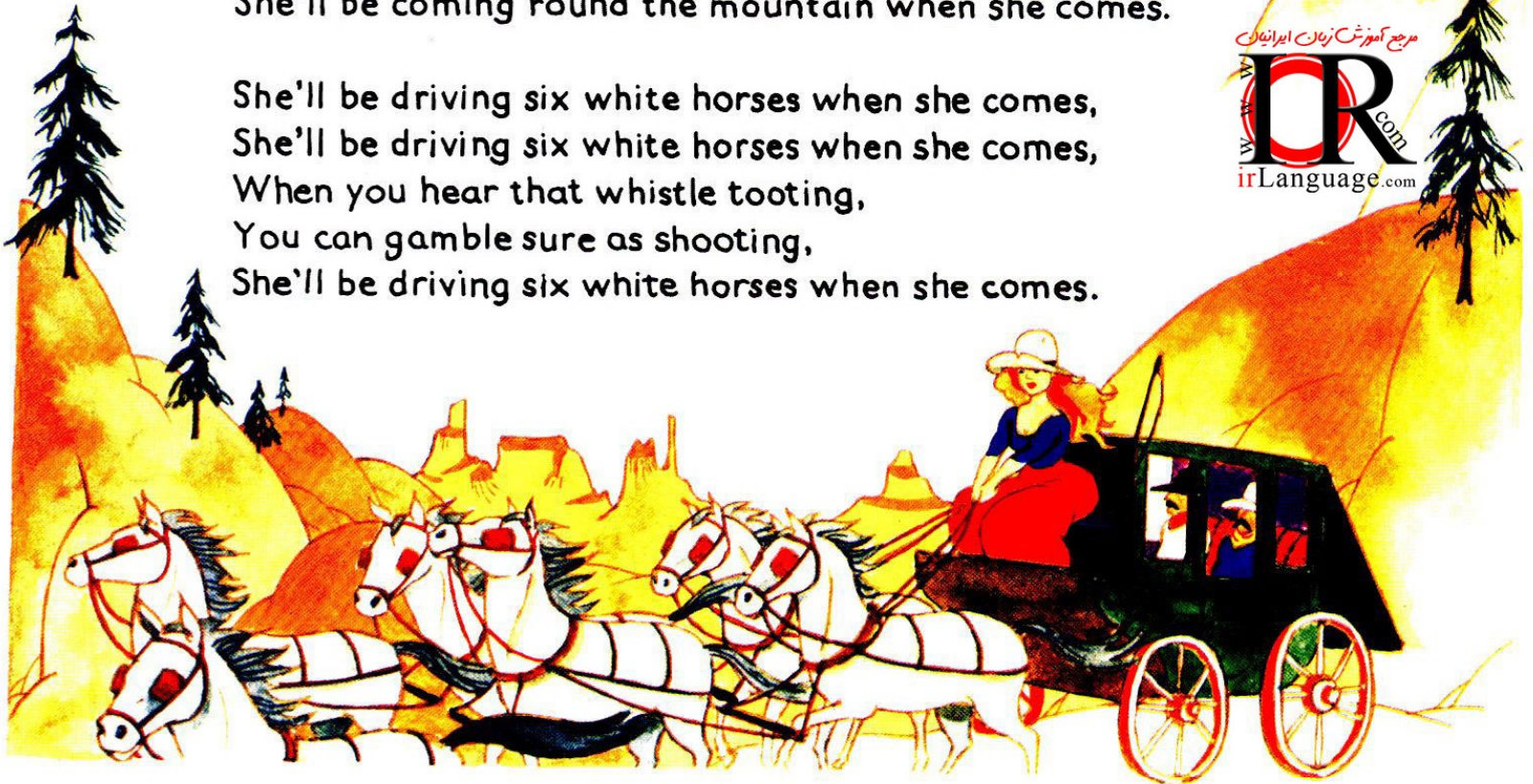


SHE'LL BE COMING ROUND THE MOUNTAIN

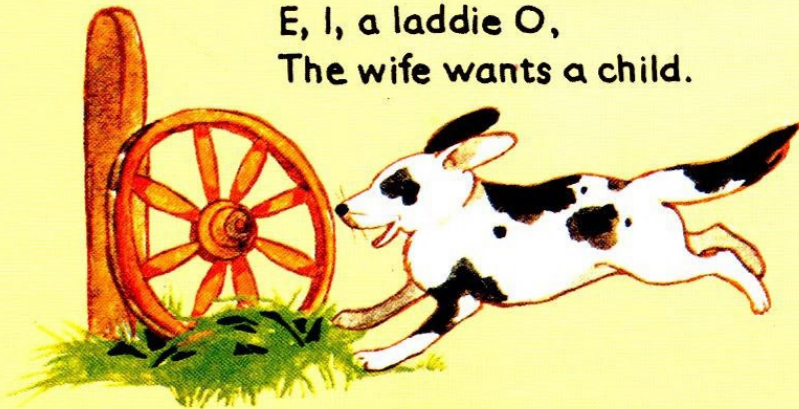
